# PILGRIMAGE TO EL SALVADOR

Please find details of our proposed pilgrimage to El Salvador to celebrate the recent canonisation of Saint Oscar Romero and which also coincides with the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the killings of the six Jesuits, their housekeeper and her daughter on 16 November 1989. This pilgrimage gives an opportunity to visit the places connected with these modern martyrs of the church and to meet with people who lived through these troubled times and are now working to rebuild their society and country.

The visit will also provide the opportunity to learn about the country of El Salvador, its history (from the cross roads of pre-hispanic civilizations through to the twelve year civil war which ended in 1992), its geography (only three of El Salvador's twenty-one known volcanos are classified as active) and culture. The provisional programme is as follows:

- **Wed 06** Evening arrival at San Salvador International Airport (Aeropuerto Internacional Comalapa) transfer (30 miles) to the Jesuit **Centro Loyola**.
- Thu 07 Morning visit to the chapel at the San Salvador Divine Providence Cancer Hospital (Hospital de la Divina Providencia or El Hospitalito where Archbishop Oscar Romero was assassinated while celebrating Mass on 24 March 1980) for Mass and visit his modest quarters, now a museum, and the cancer hospital. Lunch with the Carmelite Sisters. Afternoon visit to the Museo Nacional de Antropología David J Guzám (for the development of the people and land of El Salvador, the arts, religion and economy of the country). Dinner and evening reflections.
- Morning city centre tour with visits to the Monument to Memory and Truth (which Fri 08 displays the names of over 25,000 people who where killed or disappeared in the repression of the 1970's and the civil war from 1980 to 1983 including Archbishop Romero's close friend Rutilio Grande SJ) and the Metropolitan Cathedral (completed in 1999 after forty years of renovation with its facade and upper galleries once decorated in colourful campesino motifs (now removed) designed by Fernando Llort and where Archbishop Romero delivered his homilies) to visit the tomb of Archbishop Oscar Romero in the crypt and the Dominican church of Iglesia del Rosario (one of the most visually interesting churches in El Salvador, with lines of coloured light streaming in from abstract stained glass running up the height of its two curved walls and abstract metal forms the altar and stations of the cross). Lunch. Afternoon visit the Centro Monseñor Romero at the Universidad Centroamericana José Simeón Cañas (UCA) that honours both the assassinated Archbishop Romero and Fr Rutilio Grande, but also the six Jesuit priests, along with their maid Elba and her daughter Celina who were killed within the University precinct on 16 November 1989 and are now buried in the chapel. Late afternoon Mass. Dinner and evening reflection.
- Sat 09 Full-day excursion north of San Salvador to first visit Aguilares (where Fr Rutilio Grande SJ was murdered in 1977) and El Paisnal (where he lies buried in the simple church with the people that had summoned his loyalty and affection). Lunch. Afternoon visit to the El Despertar parish centre where Fr Octavio Ortiz was shot and where later Fr Michael Campbell-Johnston SJ served as parish priest. Dinner and evening reflection.

- **Sun 10** Morning public Mass at the tomb of Archbishop Oscar Romero in the Cathedral crypt. Continue onto the colonial town of **Suchitoto** (once the centre of the indigo trade, overlooking Lago de Suchitlán and famous for it's bird life) for lunch. Dinner and evening reflection.
- Mon 11 Full-day excursion to the chapel in San Pedro Nonualco (that was built over the place where Maryknoll Sisters Maura Clarke and Ita Ford, Ursuline Sister Dorothy Kazel, and Cleveland Lay Mission Team Member Jean Donovan, were raped and murdered on 02 December 1980) for prayers followed by a visit to San Juan Nonualco (where there is a small house museum remembering the Italian Franciscan Fr Cosme Spessotto who was shot nearby). Lunch. Afternoon return via La Chacra one of the poorest areas of San Salvador to visit a school project Fe y Alegría organised by the Poor Clare Sisters. Dinner and evening reflection.
- Tue 12 Two-day excursion to the north-west of the country to Ciudad Barrios, the birthplace of Archbishop Oscar Romero. Lunch organised by the local Romero committee. In the afternoon continue to Hotel Perkin Lenca just outside Perquin. Dinner and overnight (twin-share accommodation).
- Wed 13 Morning visits to El Mozote (scene of the December 1981 massacre of 767 people by the army. Lunch. Afternoon meeting with the parish priest who served as a pastor within the guerrilla controlled area and to visit the Museum of the Revolution in Perquin, set up by the former guerrillas to commemorate the Salvadoran Civil War (1980-1992). Dinner and overnight (twin-share accommodation).
- **Thu 14** Morning return to San Salvador. Lunch. Late afternoon meeting with those who collaborated extensively in the peace treaty. Evening Mass. Dinner.
- Fri 15 Free-day for personal sightseeing or shopping or to visit further community projects. San Salvador has several museums including the Museum of Modern Art, and the Museum of Popular Art, as well as the Military History Museum (which gives the other side of the Civil War story and includes the originals of the 1992 peace accords and the Popemobile used when John-Paul II visited El Salvador in March 1993) and the nearby botanic garden Jardín Botánico La Laguna. Optional morning excursion to Joya de Ceren (a Mayan farming village preserved remarkably intact under layers of volcanic ash in AD595) and the local Mayan administrative capital of San Andrés. Lunch. Evening Mass. Dinner.
- Nacional de Artesanias (handicraft centre). Lunch. Afternoon visit to UCA to see the *Infiorata* where the main street of the university is covered with pictures made of flower petals and coloured sand in honour of the martyrs. Early evening candlelit procession, Mass and concert at UCA to commemorate the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the killing of the six Jesuit priests, their housekeeper and her daughter. Very late supper.
- Sun 17 Morning Mass. Lunch. Afternoon visit to the Cathedral to pray at the tomb of Saint Oscar Romero and to the Divine Providence Cancer Hospital (Hospital de la Divina Providencia or El Hospitalito) for quiet time. Dinner and evening reflection.
- Mon 18 Morning transfer to San Salvador Airport. (Arrive back in UK on Tue 19 Nov.)

#### ACCOMMODATION

In San Salvador we are booked into the Centro Loyola run by the Central American Jesuit Province. The centre is situated in the hills in the southern sector of San Salvador and close to the Universidad Centroamericana (UCA).

The Centro Loyola is built on a hillside and the different parts of the complex (chapel, dining room, lecture hall, guest accommodation etc) are connected by many steps. Guest accommodation is provided in simply furnished en-suite single and twin-bedded rooms with air conditioning in blocks throughout grounds.

Overnight accommodation at the Hotel Perkin Lenca outside Perquin on the two-day excursion will be in shared (twin-bedded) accommodation.

## **FLIGHTS**

There are currently no direct flights from the UK to El Salvador. Some options for 2019 include:

There will be the opportunity for daily Mass or morning prayer at the Centro Loyola. The evening sessions (as dinner is served at 6.30 pm) will include inputs from Romero Trust trustees, feedback sessions and visiting speakers.
